1992 Corvette - The 1 Millionth Corvette

October's picture happened to be of the 1 Millionth production Corvette that rolled off the assembly line in Bowling Green in 1992.




As many of you know this is one of eight Corvettes that fell into a sinkhole under the National Corvette Museum's Skydome that has been restored.



Our newest club members might not be aware of two of our associate members, Frank and Nancy Ellis, and the long and treasured history they have with Corvette;

"The Corvette Challenge went 1988 and 1989....I was an assistant manager at that time of Chevrolet Marketing Special Projects, which became the Chevy Race Shop. In 1992 I was the Motorsports Marketing Manager of the Chevy Race Shop; and about that time, I handed off the editor's job at the Corvette Quarterly. I still had responsibility for the racing promo of the Millionth Corvette...which is why the Road America Event happened in 1992...."



Josephine's Tea Room


It looks like all the ladies enjoyed themselves at the annual trip to Josephine's Tea Room. Thanks to Ruth for setting this up.
