The St. Louis Corvette Club Utah Trip  
Fall 2019

Seventeen club members will be heading west this Fall for a grand circle tour of Utah's 'Big 5' National Parks—Arches, Canyonlands, Capitol Reef, Bryce Canyon and Zion. In addition to these parks, we will be visiting the North Rim of the Grand Canyon, Page, Arizona and Monument Valley.

Our first Utah park located near Moab will be the red rock landscape of Arches National Monument which has the world's largest concentration of natural stone arches. We will travel to Island of the Sky Overlooks in Canyonlands to view the canyons and buttes carved by the Colorado River and then on to a sunset view of this land from Dead Horse Point State Park. We will explore Moab's quaint western charm during the two evenings we're there!

We will then travel to visit Capitol Reef National Park, known for the Waterpocket Fold, a 65-million-year-old wrinkle in the Earth's crust. We will take a rest stop at the Gifford Homestead for delicious pie or baked goodies amongst the park's colorful canyons and domes. We'll have a chance to pick apples at the Fruita Orchards in the park and view petroglyphs too.

Nestled between Capitol Reef and Bryce Canyon National Park we will travel along Scenic Byway 12, one of the most beautiful places on earth! It is also referred to as A Journey Through Time Scenic Byway! We will be visiting Bryce Canyon, famous for its multi-colored hoodoos and Kodachrome Basin State Park to see the sandpipe and chimney formations.

We will be stopping at Kolob Canyon, the less visited section of Zion National Park and enjoy a lunch overlooking this beautiful park. On to Springdale which is just outside the main entrance to Zion. We will take a park shuttle into Zion to see the beautiful massive canyon walls.

We travel south to the north rim of the Grand Canyon which President Theodore Roosevelt proclaimed as "the one great sight which every American should

see.” We’ll enjoy lunch at the Park Lodge and walk along the rim for a bit. Then on to Page, AZ which is close to Lake Powell. Our group will enjoy a cruise on Lake Powell to see the tapestry laden walls of the lake’s famous canyons, Navajo Canyon and Antelope Canyon. Also, we will visit a slot canyon and watch the sunset over Horseshoe Bend on the Colorado river.

On to Monument Valley where we will learn about the Native American heritage with a Navajo guide as we explore the back roads of the ‘eighth wonder of the world’. You may be familiar with this National Monument as it was the backdrop for many of John Wayne’s western movies.

From this park many people will be heading in different directions. Here’s hoping for good weather, wonderful sunsets, great hiking, delicious meals, no Corvette breakdowns and some superb fun with fellow St. Louis Corvette Club members.



## Corvette Tips and Tricks

**Got bug splats?** Wet, Used dryer sheets will remove them quickly and cleanly.

**Engine looking less than show quality?** Spray down thoroughly with biodegradable shower cleaner.

Rinse off with fine mist spray from hose. Never use a full pressure stream on engine as it may drive moisture into electrical contacts and components causing long term failure.

**Finished washing Corvette (or any car)?** Drive around the block to dry off brakes. Putting wet brakes away may cause the brake pads to rust to the brake disks, locking up the wheels.

**New “Waxes”.** Advertisements for Ceramic type car finishes are appearing. We have used a product called “Tech Shine” for a year. The product was developed for racing boats and airplanes to provide a very slick finish.

Results have been very good. Dirt seems to fall off the paint on the trucks. Jeff Craig reports that it is difficult to get car numbers to stick to the race cars.

Wash the car and apply the product to the car with a large sponge while it is still wet. Rinse off the residue and dry the car as usual. Dark colors really shine.
