Kevin's simple wishes were respected by me and three close friends. On March 23, we buried his ashes in a small cemetery in Liberty, Missouri.
















# The St. Louis Corvette Club Historical Society Column


Michelle Paillou joined in 2006. Here she is with Rick Frierdich enjoying lunch after the Veterans Day Parade in St. Louis in 2006.
