The last stop was at O Sugar! Ice Cream in Waterloo, Illinois. The temperature that day was in the upper 90s, so ice cream was a welcome treat!




## More from the Michelin NCM Bash! Article and Photos by Mike Kunst

The National Corvette Museum has engaged a 3D Imaging Model creator to model some of the most collectible cars at the Museum. On Friday morning of the Bash, they had Znyth Technologies there to display the process to create a 3D model of a red C4.

Znyth Technologies specializes in 3D scanning for museums, engineering, and product industries. Their team of talented artists, developers, and producers are dedicated to creating stunning digital assets.

The photo shows the creator working with the scanning tool and computer software. The large display shows the image starting to form. You can see the C4 emblem on the front fascia. Notice that the Corvette is on a lift. This will enable to creator to scan the bottom of the car.





The red C4 model has not been completed, but Znyth has completed 3 other models. The NCM's 1953 is one of the models. There is a third-party website that

hosts 3D models by many artists and creators – sketchfab.com. Click or tap on the button to access the 1953 Corvette!

This month we would like to recognize those members who joined the club during the month of July in past years. Randy and Ruth Howard joined just in time for the Webster Groves Fourth of July parade in July 2007. Kirt and Marcia Sheer joined just after the Fourth of July parade in July 2016. Jim and Bev Givens joined in July 2017 as well as Pat Ross. Associate Member Marie Chance joined in July 2019 and Lifetime

Member Marian Glandt joined in July 2020. Finally, Mike McElhone was "urged" to join in July 2023 after meeting Judy Giovanoni.

In July 2007, Bill Dotson was club president and our new meeting place was Pietro's Bluff (they closed several months later). We had finally outgrown Hessler's Pub which was our original meeting place. There were 63 members in the club. We had a new club sponsor, Lynch Hummer, which was then located in Chesterfield. It was also reported that then newsletter editor Mike Price earned his bachelor's degree in business administration. And we finally got our club website up and running. There were 32 cars that participated in the Fourth of July parade and plans were being made for a Black Hills-Spearfish trip out west for later in the year.

In July 2016, Mike Price was club president and we were meeting at Grand Slam Sports Bar in Fenton. The club had grown to 94 members. This month, in addition to our normal Fourth of July parade and Fritz's Frozen Custard, several members attended a Cars and Coffee at Ballpark Village. Bob and Patti Kusky sponsored their famous Christmas in July trip driving old Route 66 to the Munger Moss Motel in Lebanon.

In July 2017 when Jim and Bev and Pat joined, Ray Queen was club president and we had 101 members. A record 75 members attended the meeting that month at Grand Slam. We won the Classic Entry Award at the Fourth of July parade and the Kuskys also sponsored another Christmas in July trip as well. Also, this month we had a run to Walker's Bluff winery as well as our normal Fritz's run.

July 2019 when Marie joined shows Don Pickles leading the club and we were meeting at the Arnold Recreation Center (yeah Grand Slam had burned). We had 98 members at that time. We should also add that not only did Don have to deal with finding a new meeting place, but he also had to deal with an upcoming COVID pandemic which greatly affected our ability to have meetings and events. We were contacted by Worldwide Technologies Raceway and were asked to provide 24 cars to drive the drivers of the upcoming Indy car race. We still participated in the Fourth of July parade as well as Fritz's Frozen Custard along with a clean-up at the VA garden and a night at the races at Fairmont Park.

In July 2020 when Marian joined, as previously mentioned, Don Pickles was our

president and dealing with how to conduct business when we could not be together because of COVID. It was not a fun time. Some of the events we had scheduled were cancelled. We were able to have the club luau and were planning a club picnic for September.

Finally, in July 2023 when Mike joined, Karen Price was president and we had 101 members. Our meetings were at ELCO. We participated in the Fourth of July parade and the club luau at Kirby's house. Fritz's was also on the schedule. The big decision this month was moving our insurance from NCCC to Hagerty, which saved us money. And the Grubbs were expecting a new arrival, a Z06!


Here are a few July pictures:
