**Bloomington**, IL –Bloomington Gold Corvette's June 2025 Event will be held at World Wide Technology Raceway in Madison, IL. Scheduled for June 5-7, the Show will offer the components traditional to the June event as well as some new ones.

In addition to Gold Standard Judging, the Gold Collection, Corvette vendors and seminars, Bloomington Gold will also offer opportunities for Corvette owners to drive their Corvettes on the racetrack as well as on site Kart racing. "Bloomington Gold recognizes that late model Corvette owners want to get out and drive their Corvettes. When offered the opportunity to partner with WWTR to host the Show, we thought this would be a great time to tie in new activities to attract a wider range of Corvette owner interests." says Guy Larsen, Bloomington Gold President. "Over the years", he continues, "Bloomington Gold started to get the reputation of being a show only for early generation Corvettes. This is not true, and we hope by adding activities where owners can drive their Corvettes on a racetrack, we can re-introduce Bloomington Gold to these owners."

World Wide Technology Raceway is in Southern Illinois, five minutes from downtown St. Louis and the Arch. The raceway's 1.25 mile oval track hosts the <u>NASCAR Cup Series</u>, <u>NASCAR Xfinity Series</u>, and the <u>NTT IndyCar Series</u> as well as a number of races on their road course and drag strip. In addition, there is a state-of-the-art Kartplex which boasts an 11-turn course for Kart drivers to tackle. Both the oval track and the Kartplex will be a part of the 2025 Show.

Bloomington Gold Corvettes is the longest running Corvette Show in the country and is known for their Gold Standard judging of a Corvette's authenticity as well as an annual themed collection of elite Corvettes, known as The Gold Collection. This year our support vehicle (truck) was driven by Bev Givens with Jim as her copilot. You did an awesome job driving Bev and Jim was a great tailgate snack/drink guy! Thank you all for your outstanding fundraising efforts.

Thursday evening, we enjoyed a fabulous fried fish dinner put together by Mayor Holden and his staff. After dinner we had the opportunity to listen to three families speak of their St. Jude experience. Two wonderful survivor stories and one very sad story of a mother speaking of their daughter that did not survive. Although these stories have happy and sad endings, it confirms why we drive.

We also had the awesome opportunity to hear from Dr. Beth Stewart who is one of the top researchers at St. Jude. Her job involves 50% in research and the other 50% as a hands-on physician. We usually hear from her on Friday while we are at St. Jude, but she had a commitment in St. Louis on Friday. She spoke of their dedicated efforts to cure childhood cancer. She also spoke about a child that had a very serious diagnosis, but with the help of St. Jude he's living his life to the fullest.

As always, one of the most touching parts was our drive thru the St. Jude campus. Seeing those streets lined with employees, doctors, nurses, researchers and this year more patients were able to be out to cheer us on. To see them holding signs that say "Thank You St. Jude Drivers" brings immediate tears to your eyes. No, we thank you for all you do!

We had a great BBQ lunch in the Domino's center followed by a speaker from the St. Jude interpreter's department. Interpreters are needed as they have children from all over the world for medical treatment.

Then it was time for the presentation of the check. Drum roll please......The grand total raised was \$548,000! That is \$38,000 more than last year. This brings the 14<sup>th</sup> annual drive total donations to \$3.2 million. When they held up that check it was very emotional! Raising money for sick children and their families with a car we enjoy owning is simply amazing! After the presentation we broke up into groups and took tours around the campus.

It was interesting to talk to our first time drivers. Everyone was touched to see this first-class event in motion. Nothing but wonderful comments.
